A hot topic of frequent conversation recently has been the cleanliness of the clubhouse. Please don't forget to check the schedule for clubhouse duties which is posted monthly in the club kitchen, and also included in Soundings. If you can't work the week you are scheduled, you must make arrangements to trade hours with another member. Which segues into our work hours survey.

Each membership is required to put in 10 hours of clubhouse duty per year (5 for junior members). For any work performed, fill out the form at the south end of the clubhouse foyer, noting your name, date, what task was performed and how many hours were used.

Anything that is needed around the club can count as work hours (excluding clubhouse duties and Wednesday night RC duty) including administration, taking out the blue boxes, planting flowers, being race committee, cutting weeds, etc., etc.

It really helps prove to the rest of the Ontario sailing community that we have a special thing happening down here and it couldn't be shown without the gracious ambassadors that are our fellow members. For the third consecutive year, the event has turned over to the club a healthy profit. This year, we purchased three handheld VHF radios for our racing program in addition to handing Bill Noakes about \$350.00

The 2005 Shark Worlds are now less that two years away.

South Port may well be one of the smallest clubs to host this event. but your organizing committee isn't letting that get in the way of making this regatta one of the most memorable.
