

The haul out for this season is scheduled for Saturday October 28th. The cradle moving will take the place on Saturday October 21th. If you have not submitted the WINTER STORAGE RELEASE FORM and submitted your storage fees by October 1th please do so. These forms allow us to organize and schedule the boats for haul out, as well as setting up the cradles. We will be following the same procedure as we did for launch. More information will follow closer to the date.

For the benefit of new members, and a reminder to other members, the mast must be off the boat for winter storage and that includes the dry sail boats as well. All spreaders must be removed from the boat for storage.

Masts can be stored on the mast rack as well as on the wood picnic tables that will be set up on the lawn. Large masts can be stored on their own stands. Please put your name or boat name on the base of the mast. This past spring we almost lost a boom because there was no identification and it was next to a mast that was leaving the club. No masts should be stored between the fire pit and the club house and approximately 20'-0" south of the club house and 50'-0" from the south property line. Please do not store any items (dodger and bimini frames) against the south wall of the club house.
