June has been a very busy month for the Sailing School. The Instructor staff are back and have been working to prepare for the season.

And welcome to Emily Spengemann who is working into her first year as an Instructor.

We are also hoping to see Zach Ublansky on the team this year, but Zach is currently recovering from a (non-sailing) injury. Please join us in wishing him well.

We got through our first Adult sessions successfully, and the registration numbers caused us to utilize all three of the school Sharks. Each of these well-used boats are in need of ongoing maintenance work, so if you are capable, feel free to hop aboard and look for something that can be improved. A new 6hp Suzuki motor was purchased this month to allow one of the older motors to be removed and sidelined.

The 420 dinghies are all rigged and ready to go for the youth CanSail and KidSail sessions, which are also full this year. We have had to sand-bag the launching ramp to prevent erosion due to the high water levels. Ironically, the high water makes launching and retrieving the dinghies easier.

The new RHIB coach boats are now sitting on a new-to-us floating dock setup that was purchased from soon-to-beclosed West Port Marina in Lasalle. It is hoped that having a safe out-of-the-water docking location for the RHIBs, will lengthen their service lives.

This past month, the Sailing School received a wonderfully gracious donation in the form of a pristine J22 sailboat from a past member. This small boat is widely raced around the world. There are over 1,600 J22's now sailing in 65 active fleets in eighteen countries on three continents. At this time, how best to use this resource is still being considered.

Several club members have stepped up to volunteer to work on refurbishment of the Shark trailers. This is much appreciated and will increase the service life of the trailers, as well as just sprucing up the appearance of our equipment.

Arrangements are being made for the Dinghy Regatta in August. A regatta planning sheet is now posted in the clubhouse. If you have any time to donate towards these events, please sign up with whatever jobs you feel you can handle? The more help we get, the easier it is on all of us.

Passing of Past Commodore Frank Macdonald – June 1, 2019



Life members Frank and Cathy Macdonald joined South Port in 1965. Frank was born in Prince Edward Island, the youngest of 8 children. He obtained a B.Sc. degree from St. Dunstan's University PEI, then a Master's of Social Work from Carleton, Ottawa. His chosen profession in Social Work led him to Windsor in 1963 as a counsellor at Catholic Family Services. He became Executive Director, and held this position for 30 years until his retirement in 2001.

Frank was an avid sailor. As a child he sailed on the family boat on Cardigan Bay, PEI. At South Port he sailed a Y flyer and eventually purchased his Shark 'Pursuit'. He raced in the Club series on Wednesday nights, and continued sailing through the 2012 season. He was a very active member of South Port during his 54 years as a member, serving as Commodore in 1984. Frank skied the slopes of Michigan as often as possible during the winter months, and spent many hours in his basement workroom crafting wood pieces, including toys for his children, some of them still entertaining his grandchildren.

Frank was one of our original members who contributed to the growth of our club. South Port members send condolences to his wife Cathy, his children, David & Gillian, 4 grandchildren, family members and many friends.
