There is still a lot of uncertainty around what the summer will look like, but our planning has continued with the assumption we will have similar restrictions as last year. We expect to run 4 2-week <u>CANSail</u> sessions starting on June 29. Unfortunately, we will not be offering <u>KidSail</u> for 6-8 year olds due to difficulties with Covid restrictions and groups of younger kids.

We hope to offer adult lessons. However, that program is on hold until we know more about what we will be permitted to do. The 420s and coach boats will be getting some updates this spring to ensure safety and reliability.

This year will be using the on line registration system used by many other sailing schools in the province and country. Any children or grand-children of members receive a discount. Please email me prior to registering to get a discount code. You may have noticed that the sailing school Sharks are no longer along the driveway. They have moved on to a better life in the growing Sarnia Shark fleet. Having keelboats for adult lessons is a great idea and was very popular. However, we became aware of many insurance, Transport Canada and instructor regulations that needed to be met. This would have been very difficult with the Sharks and the dinghy instructors we have available. There is still strong interest in the adult program since switching back to the 420s last year.

The unit will be kept at the range light garden when not in use. The flashing (geese) lights on the lawn were set out in March, and a few bulbs were replaced on the dock light fixtures. The yard water, and tap on the south side of the clubhouse has been turned on for your use. Hoses are in the shed. The key is on the board in the foyer. The sprinkler pump intake pipe at the service dock is being replaced by Stu & Jim.
