Using the designated launch crew worked extremely well. I would like to thank the crew for their hard work making this years launch a success. There were a few glitches that were quickly overcome.

We had a new crane operator and a different crane this year, which created challenges with the proposed launch schedule, early start and the crane operators sequence based on the best rotation of the crane. Numbers of boats were being launched before the owners arrived, or they were running down the parking lot to catch up to their boat. Sorry for the confusion.

On Sunday the cradle moving took place with a select crew that worked very well together. On Nathan Hunter's recommendation, we used a small bobcat to stack the cradles and save the back breaking work of the crew. The large fork lift was used to move them into the storage area, and also used to launch the floating docks for the sailing school.


