### From the Racing Chair – Ken Blyth

As some of you may have found out, your RC Chairman is holed up down in Florida until late March. Do not fear, though, as I am working on some planned changes to our racing format for Monday and Thursday nights.

For Monday's; after sending out a question to the members on this topic the rolling ratings system we had been using, will not be in effect this year. The results you receive will be truer to the rating for the actual boat. Last year I noticed that most of the racer's finished tighter together which seems to indicate that all are getting better at sailing their boat. The other change designed to encourage competitors to come out each night, is to adhere to the rules in appendix A. All boats are scored according to the registered boats in the fleet, sitting on the porch while a couple boats go out to sail will penalize the boats that remain at the dock while rewarding those that make the effort. These are the only significant changes to Monday's racing.

For Thursday; we will be trying out a windward/leeward format using our existing race mark system. Upwind and downwind legs will be 0.75 mile long. There will be no long reaching legs designed to separate the fast from the slower boats. Tactics such as covering and breaking cover and position on the course in relation to your competition will be very important. The boats should remain tighter together and the competition more intense and fun. Options to alter the course mid race can be used in the event of serious wind shifts later in the series once all have had some time to get into the W/L racing. The committee boat will have more to do as well monitoring the conditions and the competitors rounding the turning mark.

Busy committee boat, busy racers, your competition never far away, should make for fun and exciting racing this year. Ken Blyth

Ontario Sailing – Race Management Course at SPSC

In case you are not aware, I am trying to schedule some Race Management courses at South Port this spring. The intent is to make us all better racers, through more knowledge about Race Committee work.

We are proposing to run two sequential courses on one sat/Sun weekend.

The Assistant Race Officer courses run on one day and participants earn their ARO certification.

<u>The Club Race Officer</u> prerequisite seminar encompasses the second day. This allows participants to apply to the Ontario Sailing Race Committee for their Club Race Officer certification. CRO certification requires participation in the 2-day course as well as regatta participation as an official.

The proposed dates will be March 30/31, but this has yet to be ratified by Ontario Sailing (it will be presented by their volunteers). I have welcomed our neighbouring clubs to send interested students as well and have signed up quite a few.
