A Message from Property Chair, Erin Bates

Happy Spring! It's great to be looking forward to another sailing season. Much work to do, on our boats and the property, but it's a labour of love, right? Ha.

For this season, we have some improvement plans for the property.

First, on many of our minds is height of the water, and its impact on the club. I've taken a look at the best data available which is from the Corps of Engineers, and it's not too bad. While they are showing that the February water level was 14 inches higher than last year, their prediction for July, the peak month, shows the water level being about two inches lower than July 2019. Of course predictions are not 100% reliable, but it's the best data available. The Corps of Engineers are speaking about this on March 18th. See the Notice on page 2.

Based on the Army Core of Engineers prediction, at this time, and a conversation with Jake's Crane, our parking lot is secure, and doesn't need action. Of course we'll reassess as time goes on and the summer's lake levels reveal themselves. Jake's Crane is confident that the parking lot will be able to support his crane this spring and fall, because even if the parking lot is soggy, he has the equipment (large pads) to support launch and haul out.

Moving on to other items, if the budget is approved, we'll be painting the ceiling and walls in the main room and hallway, as well as purchasing some much needed items, such as picnic tables and a barbeque. For ongoing maintenance, we'll be replacing the water heater, as it is at the end of its useful life. I've also been asked by the executive to look into having mast stands constructed. If you have expertise or contacts able to help on these items, or even other items that you'd like to see addressed, please share them.

We've had a good winter, so while we had protected for up to \$2000.00 in plowing, salting and maintenance, to support the winter use of the club (including dock work parties, and just plain PARTIES), we've spent under \$200 so far, leaving the balance for other projects.

So.....if you'd like to get your work hours completed before the sailing starts, please let us know. We'll be hosting work parties in March for painting prep (wall repair, furniture moving etc.), and then in May, for the spring yard clean up, and getting started on the gardening.

WORK HOUR POLICY

(Summarized March 2018)

- Work hours will be accumulated between January and December.
- Work hours are to be recorded using the slips provided in the foyer, with the exception of Clubhouse Duties that are recorded in the kitchen binder. Members are to fill out the nature of the work performed and check off the committee it is concerning.
- All work hours must be recorded and submitted in the work hour box within 30 days of performing the task or risk forfeiting the hours worked.
- No third party can work on behalf of a member and receive credit.
- Hours can be worked in the areas of Harbour, Property, Sailing School, Racing and Cruising as well as clubhouse repairs and cleaning.
- Members shall consult with the various committee chairs for a list of eligible activities entitled for work hours outside of any sanctioned work parties scheduled for the year.
- Members are responsible to check the schedule posted on the bulletin board or the website calendar for any clubhouse duties that may be assigned.
- Cradle moving, Launch and Haul-out are not eligible for work hours for those launching a boat unless approved by the Harbourmaster. Any member that dry-sails or doesn't not have a boat is encouraged to participate.
- Where the membership category permits, any work performed in cooperation with your spouse will count twice (Clubhouse duties 2 people total 2 hrs x 2 = 4).
- The executive reserves the right to audit any hours submitted.
