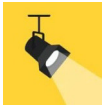

I am currently a certified mold maker since 2019, and work in the graining industry where we specialize in textures and sand blasting of molds.

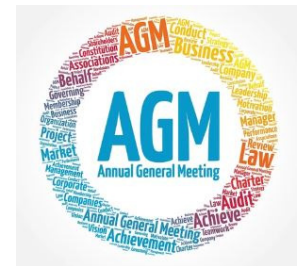

The haul out for this season is scheduled for Saturday October 26th. Cradle moving will take place on Saturday October 19th. If you have not submitted the Winter Storage & release form and fees that are due October 1st. please do so. These forms allow us to organize and schedule the boats for haul out, as well as setting up the cradles. We will be following the same procedure as we did for launch. Additional information will follow closer to the date.

For the benefit of new members and a reminder to everyone, your mast must be off the boat for winter storage including the dry sail boats. All spreaders must be removed from the boat for storage.

Masts can be stored on the mast rack as well as on the wood picnic tables that will be set up on the lawn. Large masts can be stored on their own stands. Please put your name or boat name on the base of both your mast and boom. We almost lost a boom because there was no identification on it, and it was next to a mast leaving the club.

No masts should be stored between the fire pit and the clubhouse, and approximately 20 feet south of the clubhouse rear wall or 50 feet from the south property line on the lawn. Please do not store any items (dodgers & bimini frames) against the south wall of the clubhouse.

As long as the weather cooperates, the outside washrooms will remain open, deck chairs left on the back deck, BBQ's uncovered, and the honey bucket left on site for your use.

If you are disposing of a tarp, please remember to fold or roll it before putting it in the drive bin. No plastic wrap. tape or lines are to be put in the blue rolling bin at the recycle area. Please use the garbage for these items.

I am looking for some sponsorship suggestions currently. If you have any to suggest, please send them my way?

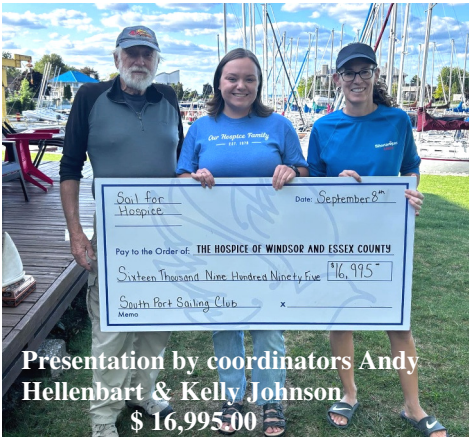
If there are any suggestions for our 2025 racing season, please let me know. Get out on the water and start sailing! Winter is coming!

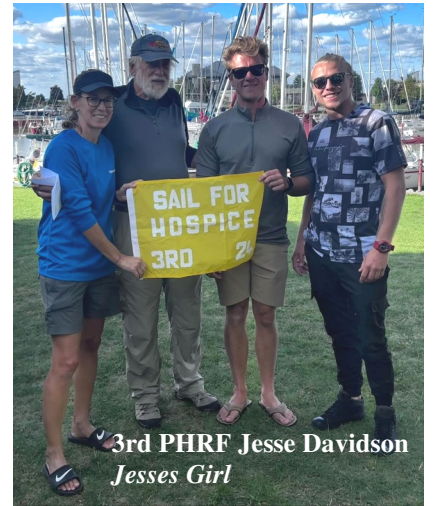
