




Racing

Race Chair John Marentette

I am writing this update on racing, the day after announcing the cancellation of the 2nd Annual Irene East Women's Regatta. On a good note, it frees up our Saturday, August 10th. On a much sadder note, I will miss the second edition of what was a really fun day last year.

The cancellation of the I.E. regatta brings us to a lack of participation in many of our summer events. Perhaps we have too many events in our summer calendar, but both participation and folks volunteering to help put them on, is remarkably down. Is this an after-effect of Covid? Please feel free to think about this, put your thoughts in writing, and forward these to me or any of the executives?

A big item in SPSC racing is the troubles with the Trillium. These have kept our RC boat out of service for a couple of weeks now. To sum these up:

- The engine has been running very poorly for some time now, and our current diagnosis points to a worn-out carburetor. A new one is due to arrive and will be installed. We hope that this will correct the engine starting, idling and driveability issues.
- The sterndrive reverse-lock has been failing. This failure allows the sterndrive to "kick-up" when in reverse, effectively eliminating any reverse thrust. (When you are heading towards something that you do not want to hit, this thrust is more commonly known as BRAKES.)

I have been inundated with suggestions on boats to replace the Trillium, and while thankful for all the input from members, the purchase of another RC boat, while justifiable to some members, is absolutely not justifiable by others. It would be a capital expenditure, way above what a Race Chair would do without executive and perhaps general membership approval. To address this, I am trying to put together a committee to look at options when it comes to replacing the Trillium with a new boat. Update in the next Soundings.

On a much brighter note, our Tuesday evening dinghy racing season is going strong.

- We have a Scratch Sheet with 5 ILCA 7's (Lasers), 3 of which are regularly racing.
- We have 29 sailors listed racing C420's, with 9 boats racing in the last Series.

A big shout out to Ed Hickey and Mike Weber, and the Sailing School staff for helping make this a fun, successful and safe event.

If any keelboat sailors wish to donate some time (work hours) helping to run the RC boat, or a safety boat on these evenings, please let me know?
