1. Rules

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 The *Members' code of conduct* and *Safe Sport Policy* applies — see the SPSC By-Laws Handbook.
- 1.3 The *Sailing Instructions* will be available either at the onshore check-in or from noticeofrace.net.
- 1.4 Any changes to the *Notice of Race* will be incorporated into this online version and posted as a notice to competitors.
- 1.5 The official notice board is in the clubhouse's enclosed porch. Notices will be mirrored on the website when possible.

2 Eligibility and Entry

- 2.1 The regatta is open to all boats of the ILCA6, ILCA 7, Optimist and Club 420 classes. Other classes can be supported by special request.
- 2.2 Eligible boats shall enter by completing and submitting the online form, paying the entry fee, and by checking-in onshore.

3 Entry and Meal Fees.

Payable By:

Fees are payable by e-transfer to spsschair@gmail.com the Junior Sailing Club Of Windsor And Essex County or, failing that, cash or cheque at the onshore check-in.

There is an early entry fee discount for e-transfers sent on or before July 31st.

Singlehanded (ILCA 7 & Optimist) Entry Fee:

\$120/sailor entry fee (\$80 for early entry)

Doublehanded (Club 420) Entry Fee:

\$120/sailor entry fee (\$80 for early entry)

Meals:

The entry fee includes breakfast Saturday & Sunday, snacks on the water, and Saturday night dinner.

A \$40 meal package is available to coaches and non-racers.

RC volunteers eat for free.

4 Coaches

- 4.1 Coaches and support boats must register in-person and list the fleet(s) and competitor(s) they are coaching/supporting. A numbered flag may be issued at check-in and must be displayed. Coaches may not dock following racing until they have confirmed that all the competitors are inside the SPSC harbor.

- 4.2 Coach and support boats are required to monitor channel 69 on their VHF radios and be available to assist with safety when requested.

5 Onshore Check-In and Race Schedule

- 5.1 The onshore check-in periods are on Friday between 1800 – 2100 and on Saturday between 0800 – 0900. Payment of the entry fee will be accepted at either of these times.
- 5.2 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race on Saturday is 1100.
- 5.3 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race on Sunday is 1000.
- 5.4 No warning signal will be made after 1400 on Sunday.

6 Safety

- 6.1 Life jackets must be worn at all times while afloat. Code Flag Y need not be displayed ashore or from the RC boat. This changes RRS-40.
- 6.2 Boats must have a minimum 5 meter long, 6 mm minimum diameter towline attached to the mast at all times. This towline cannot be normal running rigging.

7 Courses

The courses will be windward/leeward between inflatable marks.

A total of 8 races will be targeted.

8 Scoring

Three races are required to be completed to constitute a regatta.

9 Prizes

Prizes, given to each competitor, will be for first, second and third place in each class.
